

How to Memorize a Book (or books) of the Bible for Full Material

Each Day (5 days a week):

(*Do all of your memorizing and reading out loud)

- Memorize 2-3 Verses (Epistle years) or 4-5 verses (Gospels-Acts)
- Recite all the verses you have memorized in that book until you have memorized the first 30 verses (Epistles) or 50 verses (Gospels-Acts). After you have memorized more than 30/50 verses, just recite the most recent 30/50 verses each day (so 2-5 verses each day will drop off of your recitation, depending on how many you do each day)
- Read the 30/50 verses that you recited
(Until you've memorized more than the first 30/50 verses of the book, read the first 30/50 verses of the book each day)

One Day each Week:

- Recite all the verses you've memorized from the book(s)
- Read all the verses you've memorized from the book(s)

Or

- Read all...Recite all...and then read all again

(Remember to do all of this out loud – it will make it easier to remember)

The daily memorizing-reciting-reading will probably take you 20-25 minutes/day in the Epistles and 30-40 minutes/day in the Gospels-Acts.

(Over)

Write:

(As you memorize God's word, you are going to learn from God. Writing things down can really help you process and understand better what God is saying. The goal of memorizing is not memorizing; it's knowing God.)

So...Write:

- Things you see in the Scripture – connections between words and phrases (look at the conjunctions to understand how ideas are connected to one another), things that are repeated, things that stand out to you
- Things you're starting to understand
- How God is leading you to apply what you're reading/memorizing

Also Write:

- Questions you have
 - Things you don't understand
 - "Why does Peter say this?"
 - Things that don't make sense to you
- Ask God for His wisdom to understand what He is saying in His word
